What does Andy Goldsworthy use for his art?	 The materials used in Andy Goldsworthy's art often include brightly coloured flowers, icicles, leaves, mud, pinecones, snow, stone, twigs, and thorns 					
What methods can be used to change the shape of clay?	Clay can be rolled, cut, pinched, coiled, imprinted and cast in order to change its shape.
