Spelling: We will continue to consolidate Y3 summer term spelling rules, testing on Y3 word list in November.
Reading: Our class text will be 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane'.

Writing: We will be using Jane Consadine's approach to writing a newspaper text. Grammar work will focus on direct speech, relative clauses, complex sentences, and accurate use of a wider range of punctuation.

Handwriting: Even sizing of accurately formed letters.

Maths

We will be continuing to target gaps in knowledge, number bonds and tables being the most urgent. Homework will focus on these areas. We will be aiming for rapid accurate recall with no need to count on fingers!
