<p>How do holidays nowadays differ from those which your grandparents or great grandparents had?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Words and phrases relating to the passing of time eg now, then, past, present, future when talking about seaside holidays. • Holidays were focused in the UK and many people who worked in factories took their holiday at the same time hence the saying 'factory fortnight' • Many people visited seaside resorts and these became popular as it was believed the fresh air would be beneficial to health and many had a spa's. • Entertainment was focused around the beach area (Punch and Judy, sandcastles, deck chairs for relaxing, bathing machines) • Clothing differed in the past (invention of sun cream changed this)
<p>How do people travel on holiday nowadays? How did they travel to the seaside in Victorian times?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In Victorian times people travelled to the seaside by steam train. • The key form of travel once there was to walk; hence entertainment was focused within the key areas of the resort. • There are a range of different holidays nowadays (at home and abroad) • Nowadays, travel often involves planes, trains, cars and coaches.

Vocabulary

amusements	a roundabout, game machine, etc. for providing entertainment at a fairground or resort.
bathing machine	a wheeled hut drawn to the edge of the sea, used for changing in and bathing from.
clothing	materials you wear which cover your body.
entertainment	entertainment is a form of activity that holds the attention and interest of an audience, or gives pleasure and delight. it can be an idea or a task, but is more likely to be one of the activities or events that have developed over thousands of years specifically for the purpose of keeping an audience's attention.
fair	a traveling show; having sideshows and rides and games of skill etc.
historical source	a means of finding information about a time period which has passed eg first hand experience, photographs, non-fiction texts, video footage, interviews, diaries.
living memory	a time that can be remembered by people who are still alive.
modern	designed and made using the most recent ideas and methods
occupation	an occupation is the job you do to earn money.
past	things that have happened.
pier	a platform on pillars projecting from the shore into the sea, typically incorporating entertainment arcades and places to eat.
present	things that are happening right now.
promenade	a paved public walk, typically one along the seafront at a resort.
seaside resort	a resort town or resort village located on the coast.
swimwear	an outfit you wear when you are swimming.
time	time is the ongoing sequence of events taking place.
transport	the means used to travel to the seaside eg train, car, coach.
Victorian	relating to, or characteristic of the reign of Queen Victoria of England or the art, letters, or tastes of her time.
