Where is Bridlington and can you locate it on a map?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bridlington is a coastal town on the East Coast of England
What are the features of Bridlington?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There is a variety of land use in the town of Bridlington and much of the local economy is based on this, including <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ tourism (hotels, visitor attractions) ○ fishing (marina, fishing quay) • The types of jobs that people do might be different depending on where they live: eg <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ fishing, ○ hoteliers ○ entertainment industry ○ coastguard ○ business workers ○ government workers.
Where is Willerby and can you locate it on a map?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Willerby is a village and this differs to a town in terms of size, population. • It is in the West of Hull
What are the features of Willerby?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Willerby is a village that shares some similar features to Bridlington in terms of some of its land: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Housing ○ Shopping ○ services such as police, schools, library, Drs Surgery) • Willerby does not have jobs that rely on the coast, such as fishing or tourist shops
What features are the same in Willerby and Bridlington?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • That towns and villages can have similar geographical features (parks, shopping areas, housing developments, travel systems, farm land)

aerial view	a view from above
atlas	a collection of maps of the earth
coast	the part of the land adjoining or near the sea
compass point	any of the main points of a compass: north, south, east and west
country	an area of land that is controlled by its own Government.
England	a country in the United Kingdom. Bridlington is a town in England and Willerby is a village in England.
fishing	an industry based on the selling of fish to others.
human geography	features of land that have been impacted by human activity:- city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop
industry	the features of the land/region which help to create the raw materials for different jobs eg fishing, coastguards, tourism
physical geography	natural features of land: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather
sea	a large area of salty water that is part of an ocean
street view	view from the ground
surrounded	to be present all around
tourism	the commercial organization and operation of holidays and visits to places of interest
United Kingdom	the UK is officially known as the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. It includes England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
village	a small group of houses, perhaps with a few shops, that are often in the countryside. Willerby, Anlaby, Kirkella, Hessle are villages.
