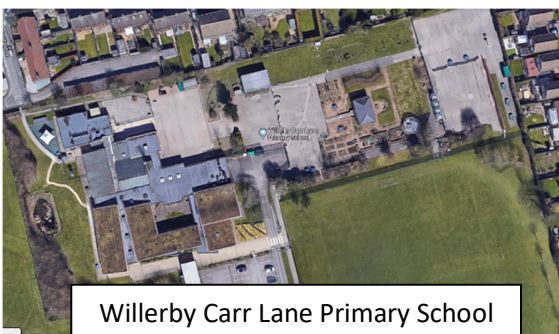

### Vocabulary

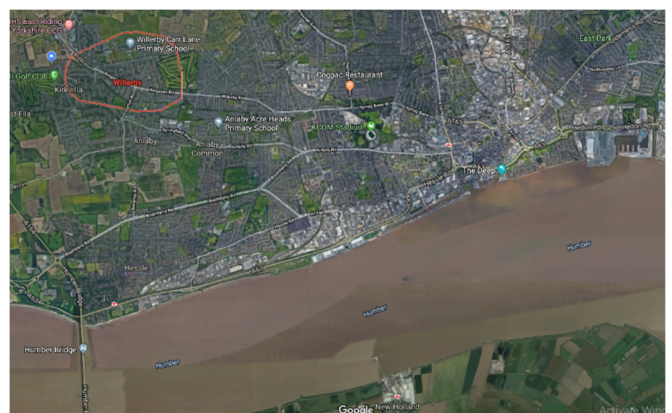
aerial view	a view from above
atlas	a collection of maps of the earth
city	a large town Hull is a city
farm	an area of land used to produce crops or to breed animals and livestock
hill	a naturally raised area of land, not as high as a mountain
Hull	Hull is a city
human geography	features of land that have been impacted by human activity
map	an aerial view drawing of a particular area such as a city or a country
market	a place where people gather to buy and sell goods
office	a building of rooms where business and work is carried out by office workers
physical geography	natural features of land
shop	a building in which goods are sold (e.g. supermarkets, clothes shops and toy shops)
train station	a place on a railway line where trains stop for people to get on and off trains
village	a small group of houses, perhaps with a few shops, that are often in the countryside (e.g. Willerby, Anlaby, Kirk Ella, Hessle)

### Geographical Skills and Fieldwork
