## **Physical Features**

- Kirima is near the forests of south western Uganda
- Bwindi Impenetrable National Park (1 mile away from the school) – hoe to mountain Gorilla listed by CNN as #1 most beautiful places in the world
- Lake Edward and 2 Rivers
- Animals as part of the biome elephant, buffalo, lion etc.
- Scenic hills located above the school comparable t the Lake District
- Kirima is on the equator
- Compare the weather and seasonal pattern of Kirima to those of Hull
