


Themed lunch - a Force to be Reckoned with!

"Together for a Better Internet"

Safer Internet Day (SID) 2020 will be celebrated globally on Tuesday 11th February 2020 with the theme: Together for a better internet.

Safer Internet Day aims to inspire a national conversation about using technology responsibly, respectfully, critically and creatively. Coordinated in the UK by the UK Safer Internet Centre the celebration sees hundreds of organisations get involved to help promote the safe, responsible and positive use of digital technology for children and young people.

It calls upon young people, parents, carers, teachers, social workers, law enforcement, companies, policymakers, and wider, to join together in helping to create a better internet.

In 2019, SID reached 46% of young people aged 8-17 and 26% of parents. They invite everyone to join them, across the globe, to help create a better internet on Tuesday 11th February 2020 and throughout the whole year. Safer Internet Day is designed to empower young people to take control of their digital lives.

As a school we will be taking part in various Safer Internet Activities throughout the week, tailored to the children's age.


The UK Safer Internet Centre is a partnership of three leading charities - Childnet International, Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) and the South West Grid for Learning (SWGfL) - with a shared mission to make the internet a better place for children and young people. Globally, Safer Internet Day is celebrated in over a hundred countries, coordinated by the joint Insafe/INHOPE network, with the support of the European Commission, and national Safer Internet Centres across Europe.

This year in the UK, Safer Internet Day will focus on online identity and asking young people to consider whether they and their peers are truly free to be themselves online.

We know that the internet is an amazing tool to do all sorts of things from communicating with friends to sharing photos and images to booking holidays to playing games to watching tv on demand to shopping and so much more. We also know that it can and does present challenges and dangers to children and adults: from cyber bullying to slander, to inappropriate content, to inappropriate sharing, to online grooming and much else besides. The challenges of teaching our children to keep safe online is only getting more difficult as the world

enters the age of the Internet of Things (IoT) and the Internet of Everything (IoE).

We have a responsibility as educators and parents to help teach our children how to keep safe. In just the same way as we



think it natural to teach children to swim or cross roads, we need to teach children how to keep safe on-line. One day they may find themselves in a dangerous place (by a stream or in an unsupervised chat-room) and they will need to know how to behave safely.

FIRST AID FOR ASTHMA ATTACKS

Our Teaching Assistants, Admin and Lunchtime Staff have recently updated their Asthma Training with David Bolton, one of the Asthma Nurses at Hull Royal Infirmary.

Asthma inhalers and spacers are kept in the 1st aid box in your child's classroom, these are

easily accessible for staff to retrieve and help your child administer if they should need it.

We also have an emergency blue inhaler in the office, if your child suffers with Asthma, or has a blue inhaler, please tick that they can use the Emergency School inhaler; it can only be used in emergency if we have written parental consent. This is only for use in an emergency as all children should have their own inhalers.

If medical information changes, please contact the office as soon as possible.


