### EYFS build underway and on schedule

Our £1/4 million EYFS building transformation project is now well underway: walls and ceilings

Our £1/4 million EYFS building transformation project is now well underway: walls and ceilings have come down, flooring and toilet fixtures and fittings stripped out, steels have gone in and plasterboard is currently going in. Our target date for handover from the builders is during the summer holidays with enough time allowed for us to fit out. The builders are making good progress and are currently ahead of schedule.

Our EYFS team have also concurrently commissioned the Early Excellence National Centre in Huddersfield to design a learning environment that inspires best practice in Early Years Foundation Stage. The EEX team are experts in EYFS and are established as a national leader of pedagogy, provision and practice, specialising in young children's education.

There will be a lot of hard work over the summer from builders and our staff to be ready for opening on Tuesday, September 6th. It is already really exciting to see the learning environment take shape, bit by bit, and we will keep you posted on progress each week on Twitter...

### **Sports Round Up**

As usual, it has been a very busy term for sporting opportunities:

**Tag rugby** - we had a year 4 cluster competition on 11th May at Kirkella. Our squad won the majority of their games, but came 2nd to Anlaby Acre Heads. A few of our squad had never represented school before.

Our year 5/6 squad also attended a cluster competition at Hullensians in Anlaby. We won our group and were in the first/second place final ultimately coming 2nd against Anlaby Acre Heads in a very close match.

**Athletics** - on 26th May we took a variety of squads to a quad kids tournament at Kirkella which lasted all day. It involved sprints, long distance running, throwing and long jump. All competitors completed all disciplines. We had some amazing individual performances and our squad finished second overall.

**Netball** - we won the cluster tournament with our year 6s earlier in the year, but the final was during PGL so we sent a year 5 squad in their place. They came 4th in their group.

### Football

The girls' squad continued their winning streak with a win against North Ferriby in the Humberside FA knockout cup final in early July. The final against Westfield is at St Mary's this coming Tuesday.

The squad also qualified for the finals of the ER primary school football league and won it, beating all 5 other teams and not conceding a single goal.

The year 5/6 mixed squad also qualified for the ER league finals. They won all but one of their games. They lost only to Kirkella who were the eventual winners.

**Cricket** - On 24th June we were the representatives for our cluster at the Kwik Cricket finals at Beverley Cricket Club. (We had beaten Wolfreton's year 7 team in a friendly in the run up to the competition.) We came 3rd in our group of 4, winning 2 and losing 2, but won the 5th place play off. Brilliant effort that only 2 of our squad had ever played competitive cricket before.

**Haltemprice sports** - on 29th June we took 41 children from years 3 - 6 to Costello for the annual athletics competition. Each event is an individual event, rather than a team event. In total, 22 of our squad came either 1st, 2nd or 3rd and have been invited to the award ceremony on Monday 11th July.

### **Cost of Living Pressures**

We are very mindful of the cost of living pressures that families are experiencing and their anxieties about the financial year ahead. At school, we are similarly affected; our school energy bill alone is expected to treble in 2022-23 to nearly £50,000.

We want to help families with these costs pressures wherever possible whilst still providing children with quality first teaching, a



broad, balanced and exciting curriculum and valuable additional experiences.

To this end:

- from September, we are no longer asking parents to purchase their child a copy of the class text that they study in Reading Mastery lessons each term. Instead, school will purchase class sets which we will keep for re-use each year. It does mean that children will not be able to underline or highlight text in the books, but we can find alternative methods for them to make a note of any key vocabulary or passages.
- at Christmas, we will once again book the Bigfoot Online Pantomime rather than ask parents to pay for an expensive trip to Hull New theatre. The Bigfoot Online Panto has been a great hit during Covid—especially as they include references to our staff in the show. If we are lucky, the PFA might once again purchase the ice-creams.
- our school meals continue to be great value for a nourishing, healthy and balanced hot dinner. Our price is currently £2.25 which is a lot cheaper than many other schools. By comparison, many schools currently charge £2.50 and have plans to raise their prices to £2.75 in September. We will be reviewing our prices in the summer holidays, and sourcing best value from catering suppliers, with the aim of keeping prices as low as possible.
- over the summer we are having lockers (without keys) installed for the children in Years 4 to 6. This will not only help keep the school tidier but should reduce the amount of lost property that accumulates each half term; items that have been costly to buy and are frustratingly costly to replace. (Nonetheless, please continue to label ALL items clearly to help us get them back to your child if lost.)

Children may bring their own sun cream labelled with their name, but


